Detailed Written Statement of Philosophical Beliefs

I am a lawyer in good standing in the State of Delaware and the District of Columbia.

For the reasons set forth below, I request an exemption and waiver as described herein and to the fullest extent required or available.

I am a supporter of Pennsylvania House Bill 262 (the "Right To Refuse Act"), sponsored by Representative Russ Diamond, Republican, of Lebanon County, which was introduced before the Pennsylvania Legislature by Representatives Diamond, Gleim, Hamm, Kauffman, Metcalfe, Moule, Rowe, Ryan, Smith, Zimmerman, Nelson, Maloney, Rader, Jones, Cook, DaVanzo, Borowicz, Pennycuick, Gillen, Greiner, Lewis, Helm, Rothman, Roae, Silvis and Berstine on January 26, 2021.

As stated by Representative Diamond, "An employee's body is their own, and employers should not be permitted to require invasive medical tests or vaccinations as a condition of employment."

I object to the proposed medical test or vaccination on all the grounds stated by Representative Diamond in the

paragraph above or otherwise in connection with the sponsorship, debate, and passage of the Right To Refuse Act or any associated legislation.

As you may know, the Right To Refuse Act will prohibit employers from discharging, refusing to hire, threatening or otherwise discriminating or retaliating against current or prospective employees who refuse to participate in a vaccination or an invasive medical test required by the employer. Employers would also be prohibited from taking adverse actions against employees who inform other employees of these provisions. Under the Right To Refuse Act, employees who experience discrimination or retaliation have the right to bring a civil action against their employer within three (3) years of the violation and would be entitled to reinstatement, restitution (equal to three times the amount of the employee's wages and fringe benefits), reasonable attorney fees and costs, and any other court-approved relief.

I object to the particular invasive medical test or injection on the grounds that the test or injection (i) has not been approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration (the "FDA") or (ii) has been approved by the FDA after expedited development and review permissible under Section 506 of the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act (52 Stat. 1040, 21 U.S.C. § 356), if the expedited development and review was completed in less than three years.

I further object to the proposed injection on the grounds that I have already been infected with the disease that the required injection is intended to prevent.

I am also a supporter of Senate Bill 471 (the "Medical Freedom Act"), sponsored by Senator Doug Mastriano, Republican, of Senate District 33, which was introduced before the Pennsylvania Legislature by Senators Mastriano and Hutchinson on March 25, 2021.

As stated by Senator Mastriano, "The ability to make decisions about what goes into our bodies is a basic human right. This personal autonomy is challenged whenever any level of government requires mandatory vaccinations. Indeed, inserting needles into a human body is the very definition of intrusive.... The state government shall not impose upon ourselves—or our children—without consent. Nor should the government mandate that employers require vaccinations. All vaccination decisions should be between a patient and their physician, including the right to informed consent, or informed refusal. Pennsylvanians are perfectly capable of making our own health and safety decisions. We do not need government intrusion in our lives."

I object to the proposed medical test or vaccination on all the grounds stated by Senator Mastriano in the

paragraph above or otherwise in connection with the sponsorship, debate, and passage of the Medical Freedom Act or any associated legislation.

As stated in the Medical Freedom Act, “Every resident in this Commonwealth has the inalienable right to bodily integrity and should be free from any threat or compulsion that the individual must receive a vaccination” and “An individual who exercise the right not to be vaccinated must not be denied any right or privilege of citizenship.”

I object to the proposed medical test or vaccination on all the grounds stated in the paragraph above or otherwise in connection with the sponsorship, debate, and passage of the Medical Freedom Act or any associated legislation.

As stated in the Medical Freedom Act, “Employers are prohibited from taking any adverse employment action against an individual who declines a vaccination, including, but not limited to, termination, suspension, involuntary reassignment, unpaid leave, demotion, harassment or coercion. If an employer violates the provisions of this paragraph, an aggrieved employee shall have the right apply for and receive unemployment benefits.”

I object to the proposed medical test or vaccination on all the grounds stated in the paragraph above or otherwise

in connection with the sponsorship, debate, and passage of the Medical Freedom Act or any associated legislation.

The Medical Freedom Act will prohibit the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, its political subdivisions or its agents, from mandating that persons receive a vaccination. If an official or entity recommends vaccination, they must provide notice that the recommendation is not mandatory. Furthermore, the Medical Freedom Act states that persons who exercise the right not to be vaccinated—or the “inalienable right to bodily integrity”—cannot be denied any right or privilege, on the basis of their refusal to be vaccinated, of: (i) citizenship, (ii) employment, (iii) access to education, (iv) the ability to travel, (v) entry into a public place, (vi) the ability to purchase goods or (vii) medical care. Under the Medical Freedom Act, employers are prohibited from taking the following adverse actions against individuals who refuse vaccination: (a) termination, (b) suspension, (c) involuntary reassignment, (d) unpaid leave, (e) demotion, (f) harassment or (g) coercion.

Further, I object to the proposed medical test or vaccination in that I believe that (i) Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus does not hold a medical degree but rather a Doctor of Philosophy in Community Health from the University of Nottingham, (ii) Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus is a war criminal associated with crimes committed by the DERG in Ethiopia, (iii) Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus has

covered up multiple outbreaks of cholera in Ethiopia, (iv) Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus is not an elected or appointed official of the federal or any state or any municipal government of the United States and yet his leadership of the World Health Organization, from which I believe our country should withdraw, has dictated our response to COVID-19.

Further, I object to the proposed medical test or vaccination in that I believe that (x) Dr. Judy Mikovits, a former colleague of Dr. Anthony Fauci, the Director of the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases, has accused Dr. Fauci of fraud and collusion with respect to COVID-19 and (y) United States Senator Marco Rubio has accused Dr. Fauci and others of manipulating public perception surrounding COVID-19, making untrue statements about masks, and distorting the level of vaccination needed for herd immunity.

Further, I object to the proposed medical test or vaccination in that I believe that the Coronavirus derives from illegal bioweapon programs in Fort Detrick, Dugway Proving Grounds, the Center for Disease Control (together with its affiliates, including the FDA, and any affiliates thereof, the "CDC") as expressed by physicians including Dr. Judy Mikovits, and that it is wrong to support such programs, and I do not trust the CDC, which I believe is beholden to the military-industrial complex and to political, corporate, insurance, and pharmaceutical interests.

Further, I object to the proposed medical test or vaccination in that I believe (a) the Inspector General of the City of Philadelphia is investigating the Department of Health with respect to COVID-19, (b) the Deputy Health Commissioner, Dr. Caroline Johnson, has recently resigned, and (c) Mayor Jim Kenney has requested an internal investigation of the Department of Health with respect to COVID-19.

Further, I object to the proposed medical test or vaccination in that I believe that it may cause autism, vaccine overload, epileptic seizures, allergies, multiple sclerosis, and autoimmune diseases; that it may have unsafe ingredients and has not been sufficiently tested; that it may transmit bovine spongiform encephalopathy, hepatitis, and HIV; and that it may cause other unspecified disorders or death.

Further, I object to the proposed medical test or vaccination in that I believe that the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine, the Moderna COVID-19 Vaccine, the Janssen COVID-19 Vaccine, and other vaccines, although approved by the CDC, may cause severe fever, severe fatigue, severe headache, severe chills, severe vomiting, severe diarrhea, severe muscle or joint pain, acute appendicitis, myocardial infarction, cerebrovascular accident, and neurological side effects resulting in incapacity or death.

Further, I object to the proposed medical test or vaccination for all the reasons set forth in Exhibit A hereto.
