Dear Sir or Madam:

I am a lawyer in good standing in the State of Delaware and the District of Columbia, while I have received a threat by email in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 875, which provides “Whoever, with intent

to extort from any person, firm, association, or corporation, any money or other thing of value, transmits in interstate or foreign commerce any communication containing any threat to injure the property or reputation of the addressee or of another or the reputation of a deceased person or any threat to accuse the addressee or any other person of a crime, shall be fined under this title or imprisoned not more than two years, or both.”

The email is fraudulent in that it makes false claims about me, while I suspect it was sent out en masse to dozens, hundreds, or thousands of recipients, as the foolish criminal who sent the thing also claims to have violated Pennsylvania’s Wiretapping Statute, 18 Pa. Stat. Ann. § 5703, which makes the purported interception of computer information a third degree felony, carrying a maximum penalty of seven years in prison with a fifteen thousand dollar fine.

And the email further contains an attempt to violate 18 Pa. Stat. Ann. § 3923 through Theft by Extortion, which carries similar penalties.

The illegal threat came from [anrmkczs@vtidvnge.goiwc.com](mailto:anrmkczs@vtidvnge.goiwc.com), while it demands the payment of two thousand dollars to a bitcoin wallet identified as 1P4ZgDofUJNQ53Xoqj1r148a9JjD1atDFj.

I have ignored and deleted the communication, except for its publication, which I have made in my capacity as an independent journalist and a political activist at [www.fightingmonarch.com](http://www.fightingmonarch.com).

You can view the email there, while I have nothing more to say about this matter, and forbid you to contact me, although I hope you will prosecute the above-identified criminal to the fullest extent of the law.
